

Ladies and Gentlemen:

We submit herewith the Ninth Annual Report of the Mississippi Medicaid Commission, covering the Fiscal Year ended June 30, 1978. It is being submitted in accordance with requirements of Section 43-13-127 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended. In it we have attempted to provide a broad range of factual information about Mississippi's Medicaid Program in an effort to keep you and the general public fully informed.

We wish to acknowledge the vital roles played by the State Department of Public Welfare, the State Board of Health, the Mississippi Foundation for Medical Care, and the Medicaid fiscal agent, Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Mississippi, Inc., in the ongoing administration of the Medicaid Program. We also wish to acknowledge the health professionals in our State who provide the necessary health services and who offer technical assistance to the Medicaid Commission through its advisory committees.

On behalf of approximately 286,000 Mississippians who are helped through the Medicaid Program, we wish to thank the Governor and the members of the Legislature for continuing to make these services available.

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INTRODUCTION

Medicaid is a program of medical assistance for the needy administered by the states using state appropriated funds and Federal matching funds within the provisions of Title XIX of the Social Security Act as amended. In Mississippi, the Medicaid Program began on January 1, 1970. The program is administered in Mississippi by the Medicaid Commission by authority of Section 43-13-101 et. seq. of the Mississippi Code of 1972. Section 43-13-105 of the Code designated the State Department of Public Welfare as the certifying agency for determining eligibility for Medicaid.

The medical care provided by the state program varies widely from state to state. A few states limit coverage to those services required by the Social Security Act while several states cover all permissible services. During Fiscal Year 1978, Mississippi provided coverage for seven optional services in addition to the eight mandatory services. Services provided in Mississippi were:

Mandatory Services:

Inpatient Hospital Service
Outpatient Hospital Service
Other Laboratory and X-Ray Services
Skilled Nursing Home Services
Physicians Services
Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis and Treatment Services (for age 20 and under)
Home Health Services
Family Planning Services

Optional Services covered

Prescribed Drugs
Dental Services (Emergency extractions for adults)
Intermediate Care Facility Services
Eyeglasses (necessitated by eye surgery)
Tuberculosis and Mental Institution Services (for age 65 and over)
Christian Science Sanatoria Care and Services
Emergency Ambulance Services

MEDICAID ELIGIBLE PERSONS

In the text of this report, the term eligible refers to a person who has been certified by the Department of Public Welfare as having met the necessary requirements to receive Medicaid benefits under one of the following approved categories:

Aged (65 and over)

Blind

Disabled

Aid to families with Dependent Children (AFDC)

Children within the families (AFDC Children)

Caretaker relative for the children (AFDC Adults)

Child Welfare Service Foster Care Children (CWS Foster Care)

In each instance, the individual must meet the requirements of financial need and relatedness to the category for which he applies. 'Relatedness' also includes the following statutory extensions of coverage:

Children 18 to 21 years of age who meet all AFDC requirements except age (the care-taker relatives are included in coverage)

Children who meet eligibility requirements for AFDC except for the "living with" factor and are placed in a private foster home with payment made from AFDC funds.

Persons who are patients in a medical facility and who, if they left such facility, would qualify for assistance (money) payments under Aged, Blind, Disabled, or AFDC Programs.

Persons meeting all requirements for eligibility except the income limits may become eligible for Medicaid in certain situations through a "spend-down" procedure whereby the excess income is either spent or obligated for medical services.

Mississippi statutes assign the responsibility of determining eligibility for the Medicaid Program to the Mississippi State Department of Public Welfare. Prior to January 1, 1974, this was largely a by-product of the Welfare Department's regular work in processing applications for public assistance grants, and there was little additional cost to the state, since Medicaid eligibility was automatic for those persons found eligible for a money payment. This is still true with respect to the AFDC category and the CWS Foster Care category. However, on January 1, 1974, a Federal program of financial assistance to the Aged, Blind and Disabled, known as Supplemental Security Income (SSI), was implemented. The provisions of the new program, Title XVI, effected the transfer of financial assistance for the Aged, Blind, and Disabled from the State Department of Public Welfare to the Federal government. However, Public Law 92-603 which amended Title XVI of the Social Security Act gave states the option of continuing to determine Medicaid eligibility for these categories or to provide Medicaid assistance to those receiving SSI. Mississippi chose to continue eligibility determination by the State Department of Public Welfare. The cost for eligibility determination in these adult categories is now reflected in the Medicaid budget.

With 5,482 applications for medical assistance pending at the beginning of Fiscal Year 1978, an additional 59,324 applications were received at the County Welfare offices throughout the year. Of these, 31,245 were approved and 27,303 were denied or disposed of for other reasons. At the end of the year, 6,258 applications were still pending. Eligibility certification is represented by a Medicaid Identification Card, valid for one month only. The Department of Public Welfare mails a new card monthly to each eligible person except to the Foster Care children. Cards for the latter are issued semi-annually. Information contained on the Medicaid card includes the individual's name, unique identification number and current period of eligibility. It must be shown to the provider each time a medical service is requested.

During Fiscal Year 1978, 343,295 persons in Mississippi were eligible for Medicaid benefits for some period of time. The length of eligibility periods for these persons covered all possibilities - from one day to the entire year. Table 1 gives the eligibility count with the corresponding percents for the program categories. In Table 2, the monthly number of eligibles is shown by program category.

ELIGIBLES BY COUNTY OF RESIDENCE

The population estimates for July, 1976 (as computed by the Bureau of the Census, U. S. Department of Commerce) and the number of persons eligible for Medicaid on June 30, 1978, are listed by counties in Table 3. The 1976 census figures are the latest available. Holmes County had the highest percent of Medicaid eligibles with 35.2 percent, and Jackson County had the lowest percent, 2.7.

MEDICAID RECIPIENTS

During Fiscal Year 1978, 285,625 different persons benefited from one or more of the medical services covered by the Medicaid Program. This was a decrease of 4,104 persons or 1.4 percent from Fiscal 1977. The monthly average number of recipients shows a 0.3 percent increase over Fiscal 1977. The distribution among the program categories remained relatively the same for the unduplicated totals. However, the monthly averages show a drop of 0.8 percent for the Aged and a gain of 1.4 percent for the AFDC Children.

Table 4 illustrates the recipient distribution by program category while Table 5 shows the monthly recipient count by program category.

UTILIZATION RATE

In Fiscal Year 1978, the average monthly utilization rate increased slightly from the 45.0 percent rate of Fiscal Year 1977 to 46.8 percent. This was an increase of 1.8 percentage points. The lowest utilization was in July, 1977.

Table 6 gives the monthly utilization rates and the average monthly rates. Using the total number of eligibles and the total number of recipients, Table 7 shows the wide range of utilization among the program categories in Fiscal Year 1978.

PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION

FEDERAL/STATE FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITIES

The Mississippi Medicaid Program is administered by the Medicaid Commission using funds appropriated by the State and Federal matching funds. Federal matching rates vary considerably depending upon their use in providing medical services for eligibles or in meeting administrative costs of the program. The variation in matching rates is illustrated in Chart 1.


During Fiscal Year 1978, the total administrative expense was \$9,079,118, with the Federal government paying \$4,359,067 or 48.01 percent. This total included all state agency cost, all cost of processing and paying claims by the Medicaid Fiscal Agent, Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Mississippi, Inc., and all of the Department of Public Welfare's cost in eligibility determination for the adult categories.

During Fiscal Year 1978, the FMAP (Federal Medical Assistance Percentage) for most medical services in Mississippi was 78.09 percent. A state's FMAP is a calculated percentage based on the state's per capita income. This percentage is redetermined every two years.

Exceptions to the 78.09 percent FMAP for medical services were: Family Planning Services at 90 percent Federal Money; Buy-In, Part B, for non-money payment individuals at 100 percent state money and the service-related inspection of nursing homes at 100 percent Federal money.

In accordance with the Social Security Act and Mississippi Medicaid Law, payment for services under Medicaid is always secondary to other third party liability. At the time of a recipient's admission to a hospital and at each of his visits to a doctor's office or other service provider, a determination is made as to whether the recipient has third party coverage. Since Medicaid liability is always secondary, any third party payments up to the amount expended by Medicaid are required to be refunded to the Medicaid program. A total of \$931,581 was collected in third party payments and was used to reduce the cost of medical services from \$171,949,077 to \$171,017,496.

The total Medicaid expenditures represent the cost of program administration and the cost for health care services. This \$181,028,195 total is comprised of \$138,955,213 Federal money and \$42,072,982 State money.

PROGRAM INTEGRITY

The Mississippi Medicaid Commission is responsible for conducting on-site investigations of providers and for monitoring both provider and recipient utilization in the Medicaid Program. The Medicaid Commission is required, under both state and Federal laws, to conduct periodic checks of provider records in order to verify actual receipt of services for which payment has been made and to investigate any cases suggestive of program abuse or misuse.

The existence of the Program Integrity Division continues to serve as an invaluable deterrent to potential fraud and abuse of benefits in the Medicaid Program. Activities in this area continue to expand and keep pace with the growth of the program.

With the assistance of a computerized surveillance and utilization reporting system, the Commission is able to maintain practice and service profiles on all providers of service and on recipients who participate in or receive services through the Medicaid Program. These profiles provide indicators of possible fraudulent activities or abuse of Program benefits and are an important source of information upon which the Program Integrity Division bases its investigations. Examples of the recipient, ratio of laboratory procedures to medical visits for a physician, the average length of stay of recipients for a hospital, and extractions per recipient for a dentist. Exceptional reporting techniques are used to identify the unusual or exceptional profiles.

Reports of any investigations which reveal a significant irregularity are made to the Commission at its monthly meeting. During Fiscal Year 1978, the Program Integrity Division conducted on-site investigations of 280 providers of Medicaid services. This resulted in one provider being terminated from the Medicaid Program, four providers being placed on probation and \$69,818.98 refunded to the Commission. In an effort to control recipient abuse and over utilization of Medicaid services, recipient investigations were begun in Fiscal Year 1978.

CLAIMS PAYMENTS

For Fiscal Year 1978, 5,934,184 claims were received by the Medicaid Claims office. This represents an increase of 270,992 claims or 4.8 percent from Fiscal Year 1977. Table 8 lists the number of claims received by month for each type of service covered under the Medicaid Program for Fiscal Year 1978.

Based on recent Federal and State audits of the Medicaid Program, "clean" claims (those properly filed) are being paid within 10 - 15 days from date of receipt at the Medicaid Claims office. There are, of course, exceptions to this where eligibility questions exist or where additional information may be needed, but these represent a very small percentage of the total.

The Commission's contract with Blue Cross and Blue Shield provides for reimbursement of administrative expenses based upon actual audited reasonable cost. Cost reimbursement principles used for this purpose are those established under the Medicare Program.

The fiscal agent contract was for a two-year period ending on June 30, 1978 and was extended for six (6) months until December 31, 1978. Monthly advances of administrative funds were made to Blue Cross and Blue Shield based upon a reasonable projection of administrative costs over the annual period. The monthly advances were subject to adjustment based upon actual cost experience.

Requests for bid proposals to serve as fiscal agent were advertised during the year. Through the competitive bidding process Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Mississippi, Inc. won the bid and will continue as fiscal agent for a three (3) year period beginning January 1, 1979.

Blue Cross and Blue Shield is a non-profit medical and hospital service corporation organized under the laws of the State of Mississippi. The company serves, in addition to Medicaid, as the Federal government's intermediary for Part A of Medicare and also serves as one of the contractors for the Federal Employees Insurance Program. In addition, the company insures many other persons through its private business.


EXPENDITURES BY TYPE OF SERVICE

Total medical expenditures for Fiscal Year 1978 amounted to \$171,949,077. This was an increase of \$37,942,185 over Fiscal 1977, and represented a larger rate of increase, 28.3 percent, than the 9.7 percent in the previous fiscal year.

The medical service which accounted for the largest expenditures were Skilled Nursing Home Services with \$50,158,723, and Inpatient Hospital Services with \$43,339,062. Combined, these two services accounted for slightly more than one-half of each Medicaid service dollar spent. Drugs remained third in total funds expended with \$23,724,564.

Chart 2 compares the percentage distribution of expenditures for the major medical services during Fiscal 1977 and 1978. Two services, Physicians and Drugs, show a drop in the percentage distribution in the chart. In actual dollars spent, however, Drugs increased \$4,778,429 and Physicians' Services increased \$536,506. The large increase in drug payments was due primarily to dropping the \$0.50 co-payment January 1, 1978. Other relevant factors were the changes in drugs covered and the restrictions on prescription refill.

Table 9 shows the actual amount spent in each medical service with the percent increase or (decrease), and Table 10 gives the average spent per recipient in each service. In Table 10, the total expenditures for Buy-In, Part B Medicare has been separated into (a) the amount paid for the average number of monthly premiums, i.e., recipients, and (b) the amount paid for the 8,467 persons accreted to the Buy-In billing list during the year. Whereas the monthly premium cost is \$7.70 per month, the average back charges for Fiscal Year 1978 accretions amounted to \$87.69. Section 1843 of Title XVIII, the Social Security Act, allows for back premium payments when necessary for the individuals' correct coverage period.



EXPENDITURES BY PROGRAM CATEGORY OF ELIGIBILITY

More than half of the total expenditures for medical services in Fiscal Year 1978 was spent for the Aged Category. While only 25.7 percent of the persons eligible were in the Aged Category, the expenditures for these persons amounted to 51.6 percent of the total. Over \$50 million were paid for nursing care and drugs, approximately \$8 million for Buy-In, Part B premiums, and another \$5 million for physician's services for the Medicaid elderly persons. All programs categories increased in both total expenditures and the average cost per eligible person during Fiscal Year 1978.

A comparison of the expenditures of each program category is presented graphically in Chart 3. In Table 11, these amounts are shown with the average cost per eligible. Table 12 lists the medical services expenditures which exceeded one million dollars in the year. EPSDT benefits are only provided for individuals through age 20; and Buy-In, Part B premiums are paid only for those eligible persons age 65 or who otherwise qualify for care.

PAYMENTS MADE TO PROVIDERS BY COUNTY

The total paid to providers of medical services is shown for each county in Table 13. The recipients served by the providers during Fiscal Year 1978 were not necessarily residents of that county, but the providers were. The County data given consists of the total number of providers within each county to whom payments for medical services were made; the total number of Medicaid persons served by those providers; and the total payments made to those providers.

PAYMENTS MADE TO STATE HEAUTH AGENCIES AND INSTITUTIONS

State health agencies and institutions received \$14,616,548 for services provided to Medicaid recipients during Fiscal Year 1978. This was an increase of approximately 30.3 percent over the previous fiscal year.

The University Medical Center received 54.6 percent of the total paid State institutions. The major part of the \$7,972,881 paid to the Medical Center was for hospital services, accounting for \$7,909,257. The balance of \$63,624 was paid for medicine prescribed for Medicaid patients treated in the outpatient clinic.

The Mississippi State Board of Health, through its county offices, contributed greatly to three Medicaid services: Family Planning, Home Health, and Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis and Treatment. Payments for services provided amounted to \$1,975,105.

The Medicaid staff worked closely with all state health agencies toward reaching the objectives of fiscal coordination intended under the Medical Assistance Act. The amounts paid to individual agencies and institutions are shown in Table 15.

SERVICES

PHYSICIANS' SERVICES

During Fiscal Year 1978, a total of 2,732 physicians participated in the Medicaid Program. This included 1,977 Mississippi physicians and 755 out-of-state physicians. The largest specialty group was the Family Physician with almost half of the total number. Medical services rendered or ordered by all participating physicians for Medicaid recipients included:

369,422 laboratory procedures 216,321 injections 89,515 radiology procedures 38,891 surgical procedures

More Medicaid persons, 233,799 individuals, were recipients of Physicians' Services than any other medical service. The over-all utilization rate increased from 66.7 percent in Fiscal Year 1977 to 68.1 percent in Fiscal Year 1978.

During Fiscal 1978, \$16,457,626 were expended for Physicians' Services in addition to the \$7,918,071 paid for Part B Premiums under Medicare. Distribution by program categories shows the Aged Category with 32.6 percent of the total expenditures. A large part of the \$5,365,186 in this group was for deductible and coinsurance payments under Part B of Medicare. The children in the Aid to Families with Dependent Children who received physicians' care accounted for one-fourth of the total money paid, but the 25.0 percent actually represents an increase of 0.8 percentage points from Fiscal 1977. In Table 17, expenditures are shown for the program categories.

When the persons over 64 years of age who are caretaker relatives and covered under the Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC) Category are added to those in the Aged Category, the expenditures for this age group represent 33.8 percent of the total. However, the largest amount expended, by age groups, was for the recipients ages 21-64. This adult group, composed of individuals in the Blind and Disabled Category and the majority of the adult caretakers in the AFDC Category, accounted for 39.9 percent or \$6,566,593. Table 18 shows the amounts paid and the percentage distribution for the four age groups.

There were slightly less than one million physicians' visits during Fiscal Year 1978. The average number of visits per recipient ranged from a low of 3.0 to a high of 8.6, while the average number per eligible ranged from 2.3 to 7.9 visits. PRESCRIBED DRUGS

Medicaid eligible persons received 3,758,069 prescriptions during Fiscal Year 1978. This represents an increase of 134,769 prescriptions or 3.7 percent from Fiscal Year 1977.

Drug recipients numbered 237,898, representing a utilization rate of 69.3 percent. The average number of prescriptions per recipient was 15.8 and the average number of prescriptions per eligible was 10.9.

Tables 21 and 22 show the number of prescriptions and the average number of prescriptions per Medicaid eligible and drug recipient by program categories in Fiscal Year 1978.

NURSING HOME SERVICES

Medicaid nursing home patients are classified as needing skilled care, intermediate care or special care for the mentally retarded. Nursing homes are certified to render one or more of the above levels of care and one designated as Skilled Nursing Homes, Dual Nursing Homes, Intermediate Nursing Homes and Intermediate Nursing Homes for the Mentally Retarded. A Dual Nursing Home cares for both skilled and intermediate patients and complies with Federal Regulations governing both levels of care.

During Fiscal Year 1978, Skilled and Dual nursing homes rendered 2,646,898 days of care to 9,551 Medicaid patients. The total Medicaid cost of the care was \$50,158,723 which averages out to \$18.95 per day for patients in skilled and/or dual homes.

The per diem payment rates for skilled and dual homes during Fiscal Year 1978 were as follows:

The difference between the average Medicaid payment (\$18.95) and the above rates is due to the application of Medicaid Income to the nursing home bill. Basically, Medicaid Income consists of all of a patient's income above \$41.50 and their income must be applied to the nursing home bill. The Medicaid payment is reduced by the amount of Medicaid Income.

Intermediate nursing homes rendered 668,230 days of care to 2,670 Medicaid patients. The total Medicaid cost of the care was \$11,800,933 which averages out to \$17,66 per day for patients in intermediate care nursing homes.

The reasons for the difference between the average Medicaid payment (\$17.66) and the above rates are the same as for the skilled and dual homes.

Intermediate nursing homes for the mentally retarded rendered 187,511 days of care to 644 Medicaid patients. The total cost to the Medicaid program was \$5,134,049 which averages out to \$27.38 per day for patients in intermediate care nursing homes for the mentally retarded.

Over all the Nursing Home Program provided 3,502,639 days of care to 12,865 Medicaid patients at a cost of \$67,093,705 to the Medicaid program. Payment were made to a total of 115 Skilled and Dual Homes, 22 Intermediate Homes and 7 Intermediate Homes for the Mentally Retarded, 20 Skilled Homes out-of-state, 16 Intermediate Homes out-of state.

INPATIENT HOSPITAL SERVICES

During Fiscal Year 1978, there were 51,820 hospital discharges with 309,984 days of inpatient hospital care covered by Medicaid. The average length of stay was 6.0 days, the same as in the previous year. For the relatively small number of persons covered in the Aged category who do not qualify for Part A of Medicare, Medicaid pays for their hospital services. Elderly recipients had the longest average length of stay for each period of hospitalization. Table 24 shows the number of recipients of Inpatient Hospital Services benefits with the number of discharges and days of care during Fiscal Year 1978. Those persons who have hospital coverage under Part A of Medicare are not included in the table. Medicaid paid their hospital deductible charges which amounted to \$3,934,026 during the fiscal year.

A total of 181 hospitals participated in the Medicaid Program including 120 Mississippi hospitals and 61 out-of-state hospitals.

OUTPATIENT HOSPITAL SERVICES

A total of 167,673 outpatient hospital visits was provided to 99,629 recipients during Fiscal Year 1978. The average of 1.7 visits per out-patient recipient shows an increase of 0.1 percent from the average number in Fiscal 1977, however, expenditures for Outpatient Hospital Services rose from \$3.953,633 in Fiscal 1977 to \$5,143,553 in Fiscal 1978, representing a 30.1 percent increase.

Outpatient visits were made to 175 different hospitals, 117 in-state and 58 out-of-state during the fiscal year.

DENTAL SERVICES

Limited dental care was provided to 39,774 persons during Fiscal Year 1978 with expenditures amounting to \$1,472,742. A total of 147,324 procedures (primarily extractions) was provided at an average cost of \$9.72 per procedure. This represents an increase of 28.2 percent over last year's cost per procedure and an increase of 22.6 percent from last year's total dental expenditures.

A total of 412 in-state dentists and 13 out-of-state dentists participated in the program during the fiscal year.

FAMILY PLANNING SERVICES

Expenditures for Family Planning Services amounted to \$1,199,053 in Fiscal Year 1978 with the Federal government paying 90 percent and Mississippi paying 10 percent of the total. Payments were made to private physicians, pharmacies, and family planning clinics located throughout the state. A total of 24,711 different persons received Family Planning Services during the year, 16,304 persons receiving medical care and 15,996 persons receiving family planning drugs.

EARLY AND PERIODIC SCREENING, DIAGNOSIS AND TREATMENT SERVICES

The Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis and Treatment Services (EPSDT) furnishes a unique opportunity for providing health care to the Medicaid eligible children of Mississippi. This program requires the screening of children 21 years of age and under for physical, mental and developmental defects and provides for the necessary health care to correct or ameliorate those defects. Treatment for visual, hearing and dental problems is also provided. Thus, EPSDT introduces eligible children into the health care system and makes services available before health problems become chronic and expensive to treat.

Good health is not the only factor for the development of a productive adult who is independent of public assistance. However, poverty and untreated health defects often lead to dependency and the perpetuation of the welfare cycle. A DHEW estimate of an individual cost of \$200,000 for a life-time welfare recipient makes the importance of the EPSDT program significant.

During Fiscal Year 1978, a total of 68,934 children received screening services. Among those screened, 58,953 children, or 86 percent, were found to have at least one abnormal condition, and 12,717 children, or 18 percent, were found to have never had a physical examination before, Referrals for follow-up care are as follows:

Such significant figures pointedly illustrate the merits of Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis and Treatment Services for the children of Mississippi.
