Besides providing information to the six areas in 4.13.1, should this section of the Technical Proposal provide any additional information from 4.13? Number 6 under 4.13.1 asks for, “....date of birth, and Social Security Number of any managing employee of the disclosing entity.” Our firm has a policy that we do not release dates of birth or Social Security Numbers of our employees. Please confirm it’s acceptable to omit this information.</p>	<p>1) No. 2) Yes, it is acceptable to omit this information for all of the employees. DOM does not need that level of detail. However, DOM does need this information for managing partners, owners of the business entity, etc.</p>
5	1.6	12	<p>DOM specifies that the contractor must have the capability to provide NADAC prices directly to DOM’s fiscal agent so as to address the time lag it takes CMS to push out NADAC prices or updates to First Databank.
