The contractor will provide services for the statewide administration of the Mississippi Children's health Insurance Program (CHIP), a coordinated care program for Mississippi Medicaid beneficiaries.

The amount noted above is the estimated spend value over the course of the one year contract period and does not reflect a not to exceed contract value. DOM is not able to determine the number of Member Months/beneficiaries that will be applicable to each coordinated care organization.

DOM has received approval of new MSCAN/CHIP contracts. However, during the implementation phase of the new contracts, emergency contracts will be in place to maintain member services. Selecting the incumbent vendor(s) ensures no disruption to members and avoids lengthy implementation processes with new vendors for a one year period.

Amendment 1 is to update capitation rates in accordance with 42 C.F.R. 438.3 as required by CMS, which ensure compliance with federal oversight requirements. All other terms and conditions remain the same.
