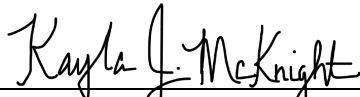

ANALYSIS DESCRIBING AWARD, RENEWAL OR AMENDMENT OF CONTRACT

The Division of Medicaid (DOM) has contracted with Myers and Stauffer, LC for accounting services largely for the audit of the Disproportionate Share Hospital (DSH) payments for work as required by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) in 42CFR Section 455.300 published December 19, 2008. The Contractor will provide an audit of all eligible providers for DSH payments, as set forth in the Mississippi State Plan. Upon completion of the audit, Myers and Stauffer will issue an independent audit report for the findings with all data requirements set forth by CMS for submission by the Division of Medicaid to CMS. This submission will satisfy the reporting requirement required by CMS. Because of the complexity of calculating DSH payments, a CPA is required to provide guidance and assistance with these services.

Accounting services are exempt from the purview of the Public Procurement Review Board in accordance with Mississippi Code Annotated § 27-104-7(2)(f).

The contract period is effective January 1, 2026 through December 31, 2028, with a contract amount not to exceed \$1,404,396.00.
